Re: Housing and Community Development Programs and Activities Report

I am pleased to present a year-to-date report of the CARES Act/Coronavirus Relief Programs and expenditures, along with other non-CARES Act initiatives.

Coronavirus Relief Assistance Report

The City established several programs in response to the Coronavirus Pandemic. Many of these programs continue to provide support for neighbors who are facing economic hardship. Some of these programs have prevented homelessness for over 480 households, by providing over 1,200 units of financial assistance. The unit of assistance included multiple months of rent payments, mortgage payments, utility payments, and emergency hotel stays.
