May 13, 2021 MPO Board Workshop Items

The May 13, 2021 Broward MPO Board workshop items are summarized below:

DRAFT Fiscal Year (FY) 2021 Multimodal Transportation Priorities List (MMPL)

MPO staff presented an overview of the MMPL which will come before the Board next month for approval.

Broward MPO Performance Measures Dashboard

MPO staff provided a presentation on the performance measures dashboard and State of the System Report which provides MPO staff with the ability to share information about the federally mandated performance measures with the MPO Board, its committees, and the public in an easy and visually pleasing manner.

Mobility Hubs/Complete Streets and other Localized Initiatives Program (CSLIP) Program Updates and Introduction of Evaluation Criteria

MPO staff presented on the development of the evaluation tool and criteria for ranking CSLIP and Mobility Hubs applications to bring them in line with the six criteria for project prioritization from the 2045 Metropolitan Transportation Plan. The finalized criteria will come before the Board next month for approval.

Review of the Coastal Link Workshop

MPO staff presented a review of the April 30, 2021 Southeast Florida Transportation Council Coastal Link Workshop.

Report from Partner Agencies - FDOT - Eminent Domain Relief Ordinances

FDOT staff presented on the usefulness of Eminent Domain Relief Ordinances for municipalities and their roadway projects.

Report from Partner Agencies - FDOT - SW 10th Street Connector Preferred Alternative

FDOT staff presented an update of the Southwest 10th Street Project Development and Environment Study. The presentation included the preferred alternative that has been selected.

BTactical Pilot Project

The City of Deerfield Beach has been selected for a pilot quick-build project. The Northeast 3rd Avenue Corridor runs south to north in the Tedder neighborhood. The project borders two bundle areas identified by the Broward MPO as locations that contain concentrations of historically vulnerable populations.

2021 Legislative Update

MPO staff and advocacy teams provided an update on the current earmark requests, federal reauthorization projects, and state legislative session.

Federal Update

On May 10, 2021 the U.S. Department of Treasury, announced the launch of the Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds to provide \$350 billion in emergency funding for state, local, territorial and tribal governments. Eligible state, territorial, metropolitan city, county and tribal governments will be able to access funding directly from the Treasury Department in the coming days to assist communities as they recover from the pandemic. The Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds provide substantial flexibility for each jurisdiction to meet local needs – including support for households, small businesses, impacted industries, and essential workers. Negotiations will continue on President Joe Biden's \$4 trillion economic plan. as the president plans face-to-face meetings this week with lawmakers from both parties. The coming week still could prove pivotal for any chances of an agreement on the infrastructure portion of the president's suite of long-term economic proposals. President Biden will meet with the top two congressional Republicans, Senate Minority Leader Mitch McConnell (R-Ky.) and House Minority Leader Kevin McCarthy (R-Calif.), just as the GOP is ramping up opposition to his \$4 trillion economic plan. The White House session will also include House Speaker Nancy Pelosi (D-Calif.) and Senate Majority Leader Chuck Schumer (D-N.Y.). President Biden plans to meet with six Republican senators – Sens. Shelley Moore Capito (R-W.Va.), John Barrasso (R-Wyo.), Roy Blunt (R-Mo.), Pat Toomey (R-Pa.), Mike Crapo (R-Idaho) and Roger Wicker (R-Miss.) – to discuss his infrastructure proposal. In opposition to President Biden's \$2.25 trillion American Jobs Plan, Senate Republicans, led by Sen. Capito, have proposed a \$568 billion infrastructure plan, but have not specified how to pay for it. Passing the spending and tax increases envisioned by President Biden will depend on where lawmakers can find compromise. But without the urgency of the pandemic -- and with Democrats less united on the overall size of the proposals than they were in approving the aid package – the plans could be debated by Congress well into the fall or even 2022.

The Broward MPO and municipal partners were supported by the Broward Congressional delegation with requests for transportation project funding. By funding these projects the MPO and municipalities are creating an interconnected multimodal system which is safe and sustainable. Please see the attached map for more details.

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State of Florida Update

FDOT Package

House Commerce and Senate Appropriations unanimously advanced FDOT's legislative package. Among other things, the package removes unnecessary requirements; raises the debt service cap for right-of-way acquisitions and bridge construction bonds; requires MPOs to submit work program projects by August 1st rather than October 1st; and grants FDOT rulemaking authority to implement statutes related to airport zoning. The Senate committee adopted an amendment to add in language transferring M-CORES funding to the Strategic Intermodal System, discontinue a transfer from the State Transportation Trust Fund to feeder roads, expand the Move Over Law for construction vehicles, and grant greater flexibility to the Legislative Budget Commission on approving Work Program amendments.

Bicycle & Pedestrian Safety

• The House and Senate voted unanimously to pass SB 950. The legislation is a bicycle and pedestrian safety package. It would add pedestrians to the 3 ft rule vehicles must adhere to when overtaking bicyclists, etc. Under the bill, cars would have to remain at a safe distance behind the pedestrian, bicyclist, etc. until the 3 ft can be accomplished. It provides that no-passing zones do not apply when a car is overtaking a pedestrian, bicyclist, etc. Cars would also have to be at least 20 ft away from bicyclists, etc. before making a right turn. The bill would also require DHSMV to promote driver education on pedestrian and bicyclist safety and add at least 25 questions on the subject to the drivers license test. Finally, the bill allows cyclists to ride two abreast if the bicycle lane is wide enough or when necessary to avoid a hazard. It requires cyclists ride single-file in substandard width lanes.

MCORES Repeal

• The Senate voted 39-1 to pass SB 100, which would repeal a portion of the rural toll roads projects, known as MCORES, the Legislature created two Sessions ago as a priority of former Senate President Galvano. The bill would redirect \$132 million back to the state transportation trust fund of which \$20 million would go to support rural aerial trucking routes. The sponsor stated the pandemic's impact on the budget necessitated the bill. It would leave in place plans for two of the MCORES roadways to be built within the same footprint as current roads and according to applicable studies and task force guidance. The House followed the Senate's lead on taking up bills sent by the other chamber and passed the bill in a 115-0 vote.
