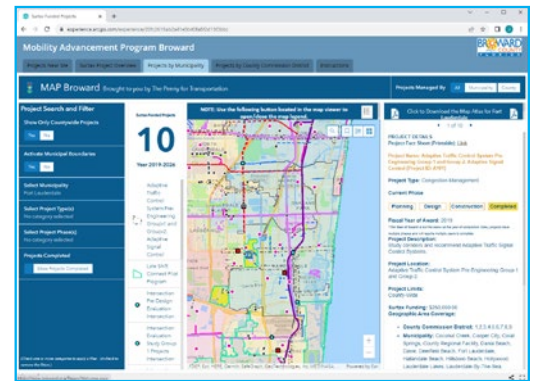
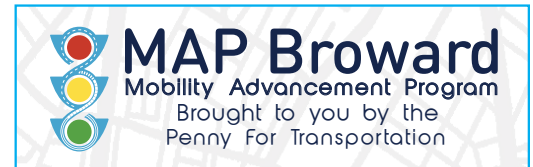

TRANSPORTATION SURTAX

In 2018, Broward County voters approved a 30-year, one-percent discretionary sales surtax. The surtax funds make up Broward County’s Mobility Advancement Program (MAP) and will be used for projects and initiatives that increase mobility and enhance transportation across the County.

On April 19, 2022, the City Commission adopted a resolution that supported and endorsed 14 municipal capital projects in Fort Lauderdale for MAP surtax funding consideration. This action affirms the City’s interest in receiving transportation surtax funds for the benefit of neighbors, visitors, and businesses. City staff submitted project applications in early April and the applications will be evaluated and ranked against project applications submitted by other municipalities in Broward County. The projects will compete for 10% of the annual surtax funding that will be awarded based on project eligibility and ranking.

The Broward County Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) is responsible for reviewing and ranking project applications while Broward County determines project eligibility, ensures funding availability, and recommends projects to be awarded. The projects submitted for consideration were based on guidance from the MPO stating that projects must either create a roadway or intersection, expand a roadway or intersection, or implement traffic calming measures. If the City’s projects are awarded, funding would be programmed in 2027.
